2022 is now behind us and it was a very interesting year that flew by. So, what can we expect for 2023?

All of our OEM's are forecasting a big year for 2023 they have a lot of catching up to do with their customers from COVID and part shortages. Unimark is planning to be conservative on our shipping numbers and if the economy and supply chain holds up, we can out pace our budget for 2023. This will be great for all of you to make as much money as you can with the amount of work we will have. We will need to add more drivers to keep up the pace.

You will also see the introduction of the electric trucks into the market and may have the opportunity to haul a few. At the end of 2022 we started moving some units. As expected, these trucks are heavier and have the batteries and their components hanging below the frame rails. They can cause some issues on lowboys as well as decking clearances.

We anticipate the release of the ETRIP to the drive away drivers to make payroll go smoother for you guys, as well as the release of Saddle Hero for the rail recovery guys, to eliminate the need for sending in the numbers. All you will need to do is scan the bar codes. This will also create your POD's for your loads. Once these are completed, I will start asking again for the load board app for you guys.

There are a couple of lowboy contracts that are due this year so you will hear about those once we have settled them. I strongly believe we will see more work and new product lines in 2023. You guys are the best at what you do, and Unimark and our customers know that, even though a couple customers may not show it much.

To improve communications with drivers we will start quarterly meetings at the terminals with upper management to inform you on what is going on with Unimark, as well as hearing what you have to say. We will get the schedule out for the first meetings after you receive this newsletter. We also will start in February two surveys; one will be completely anonymous, and the other will be simple questions so we can get a better feel on what is going on with the team. At any time, you have an idea or see an area we can improve, feel free to reach out to me anytime.

Cardinal Rules

- 5. Never undeck using forklifts.
- 6. Compliance with DOT Hours-of-Service is mandatory.
- 7. When parking overnight, always pull the ignition fuse.
- 8. Unauthorized passengers and use of our customer's trucks is prohibited.
- 9. Love our customer, they're why we're here.
 - Treat with respect. Never be discourteous.
 - Meet your ETA.
 - Call 24 hours prior to delivery.
 - Never smoke, eat, sleep, or drink in truck.
 - Leave undecking facility clean and organized.

10. Never walk/work under a freely suspended truck.

11. Cell phone use is prohibited while driving, decking, or undecking.
